

WHO'S WHO

Linda Boyett (Assistant Director/Producer) has appeared in several stage productions and has worked in many backstage and technical capacities. Linda is also looking forward to serving the Theatre Guild as President next season.

Jim Britt (Director) has been a member of TGV since 1990. He has appeared in several plays including The Dining Room, The Foreigner, Harvey, Anything Goes, and most recently The Oldest Living Graduate. Jim has also done a bit of work behind the scenes as well. He is employed at Bell South.

John Deming (Delivery Man) has been a member of TGV since 1990. This will be the first time on any stage and also [according to him] the last time. John will be back at the door greeting people and tearing tickets for next season. "I feel the only reason I was asked to be in this production was I had more white hair than other members of TGV." (Those involved with this production know it was because he was the best heavy breather around audition time.)

Jeff Fulp (Paul Batter) This will be Jeff's third on stage appearance with TGV, having appeared in *The Uninvited* as Commander Brook and in *The Odd Couple* as Oscar. He performed in numerous Theatre productions while attending South Georgia College & Valdosta State. Jeff lives in Valdosta with his wife, Dian, daughter, Lindsey, and son, Taylor. He is the Commercial Manager at Sterling Pulp Chemicals.

Joanne Griner (Ethel Banks) has been involved off and on stage since Theatre Guild was organized in 1989. She was the Guild's first president and has most recently served as membership chair. Mame Dennis - Auntie Mame, Madame Arcati - Blythe Spirit, Ethel Savage - Curious Savage & Kate Keller - All My Sons have been some of her favorite roles, and now Mother Banks - Barefoot in the Park makes her list.

WHO'S WHO

Rick Patrick (Telephone Man) has performed in The Sound of Music as Capt. Von Trapp, Harvey as Elwood P. Dowd, A Few Good Men as Lt. Col. Jessup, Arsenic and Old Lace as Jonathan, Anything Goes as Moonface Martin, and toured with Up With People 1980-81. He has directed a One-Act, King of the Pekinese Yellowtails and this past December, The Littlest Angel.

Pauline Player (Stage Manager) is in her 2nd season with TGV. Her most recent performance was as The Storyteller in Winnie the Pooh. She has also made appearances in The Oldest Living Graduate, Anything Goes, The Heiress, Once Upon a Mattress, Alice in Wonderland, Wizard of Oz, A Man for All Seasons and The Mikado. She is employed at Sterling Pulp Chemicals. Pauline will also be serving on the board next year as House Manager.

Fred Stikkel (Victor Velasco) started acting for the first time ever as the ship's captain in Anything Goes. He followed that with Mike Tremaine in The Oldest Living Graduate, and has spent endless hours on set building for all shows. "This has been a very enjoyable season and I am looking forward to next season as well." Fred is also responsible for many recent building improvements at the theatre.

Patty White (Corie Bratter) This is Patty's first main stage performance at the Dosta Playhouse. However, she brings much experience from her home states of Maryland and West Virginia. She has played Hermia in Shakespeare's A Mid-summer Night's Dream, Jessie in Night, Mother, and Cinderella in the musical version of Cinderella. She recently moved here from West Virginia to attend graduate school at VSU, and has recently graduated with her Masters degree in Clinical Psychology.

Directing Barefoot in the Park has been a dream come true for me. 
