When asked why she auditioned for this show, she replied "Didn't want to go too long before I worked with these zany people again."

Kyle Felts (Bill) - is a freshman at VSU. He has performed with TGV on two other occasions, but would like to note that this production will mark his first role as a human on the TGV stage.
