Director's Notes

I first encountered My Favorite Year in the summer of 2000 when I was performing with Jekyll Island Summer Stock Theater. Part of my duties was to organize, direct and present one of two Cabarets planned for that summer. A fellow actor performed "Larger Than Life" from My Favorite Year as his Cabaret number. Not having ever heard of the musical I inquired about it and what I got was a very enthusiastic explanation and synopsis of the show. He gave me the CD to listen to the rest of the music and that was all it took. The music was snappy Broadway style. The lyrics were clever, funny and surprisingly human for a musical comedy. The songs seemed to flow out of conversations, often skipping long introduction. But best of all the characters seemed human, not caricatures. My Favorite Year is a nostalgic, touchingly funny musical that celebrates the Golden Age of Television. It also tells the story of Benjy Stone, a wet-behind-the-ears sketch writer who looks back fondly at 1954 when he was getting started in the business, fell in love for the first time and had the opportunity to meet his childhood idol, the movie star Alan Swann. Though the overriding tone if a comical one, the score deals very poignantly with the issues of parental abandonment, and with our societal notions of what heroism is all about. Thank you to the talented and hardworking TGV company who gave their time to bring to the stage this lively, romantic, swashbuckling musical that will send you from the theater hopeful and humming.





History

TGV was organized in 1989 through the efforts of the Lowndes/Valdosta Arts Commission as an autonomous community theater group with non-profit tax-exempt status. After three years as a group of vagabond players with no home, the group purchased the old 'Dosta Theatre building in 1992 and set about converting the dilapidated movie theatre into a playhouse for live stage performances. Thanks to many supporters and one large benefactor, TGV now owns three adjoining buildings in historic downtown Valdosta. The all-volunteer group produces four main stage shows and two children's shows each year. All of this is done in order to provide a high quality theater experience for our community.
