Cast Biographies

A licensed real estate broker, Janice has attended VSU, majoring in Music Education, and Valdosta Technical College and ABAC, specializing in Office Management. She has a husband, Clifton, and two children – Amy and Michael. Janice is glad to have this opportunity to work with TGV and we hope to keep her involved onstage and behind the scenes.

Ken Kinard (Burt Hines): Ken appeared on TGV's most recently as "Bad Boy" Mike Talman in "Wait Until Dark." His previous roles include Assistant Director for "Little Shop of Horrors," and onstage roles in "Alone Together," "Moon Over Buffalo," "My Fair Lady," "Anything Goes," "The Heiress," "Winnie-the-Pooh," and many others. Ken has been a member of TGV for 6 years and has served on the Board of Directors as Vice President.

Shanon Heaton (Josie Hines): This is Shanon's second performance with TGV and her first major role. She was previously seen as Doo-Wop girl Satin in "Little Shop of Horrors." She is a senior at Valdosta State University studying Communications. Shanon was involved in high school productions of "Bye Bye Birdie" and "The Infamous Soothing System of Professor Malard." Nicholas Shanks (Ken Norman): This is Nick's second appearance on the TGV stage. He was previously seen as Dr. Sesemann in "Heidi." He also ran lights for "Crimes of the Heart." Theatre Etiquette

The following tips are reprinted with permission from the communication arts program at VSU. We hope they will enrich your theatre experience.

Stay and show your appreciation.

A quick departure is noticed by everyone in the audience, and especially by the performers on stage. Making a mad dash for the exit expresses inconsiderate behavior. The performers CAN see you, so please wait until the house lights go up.

Hearing a pin drop.

We are delighted if the performance proves to be "the talk of the town", but please wait until intermission or final curtain to carry on lengthy conversations. In addition, everyone will certainly hear the sound of a crumpling cellophane wrapper from a piece of candy. Why not "pop" your candy into your mouth before entering?

We were here... Where were you?

Arriving late to the theatre is never considered "fashionably late." After the performance has begun, we will ask that latecomers wait until a suitable time before being seated. The same reminder applies at intermissions. Leaving your seat during the performance may also keep you from being allowed to re-enter until an appropriate time.

Lovely to look at... and preserve.

Help us preserve the condition of our theatre by finishing ALL snacks and beverages before entering and depositing any trash in an appropriate receptacle. Remember, NO FOOD OR DRINK IS ALLOWED IN THE THEATRE, and as always smoking is permitted outside the building only.

The great "escape."

Just as you mentally leave your earthly boundaries and are transported to another time and place becoming one with the performers, suddenly, your neighbor starts "beeping" like a four alarm fire. Watches with alarms, cellular phones, and beepers are distracting and annoying to everyone. Please be considerate of your neighbors as you would expect the same consideration from them.

Recording.

We strictly prohibit the use of any recording or photographic device.

Just in case.

Please note where the emergency exits in the theatre are located and notice any of your fellow patrons that may need your help in an emergency.

And finally...

Above all else, enjoy the show. We are certain you will, and we are glad you are here. Please join us again soon, and often.

History of Theatre Guild Valdosta

Theatre Guild Valdosta (TGV) was organized in 1989 through the efforts of the Lowndes/Valdosta Arts Commission as an autonomous community theater group with non-profit, tax-exempt status. After three years as a group of vagabond players with no "home," the group purchased the old 'Dosta Theater building in 1992, and set about converting the dilapidated movie theater into a playhouse for live stage performances.

Thanks to many supporters and one large benefactor, TGV now owns three adjoining buildings in historic downtown Valdosta, performs four main stage shows, an evening of one-acts and two children's shows each year. All of this is done in order to provide high quality theater experience to as diverse an audience and group of participants as possible.
