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The Valdosta Playhouse

In July, 1992, the Theatre Guild Valdosta, after four years of playing "on the road", took the bold step of purchasing our own home. The old Dosta Theatre seemed to us the perfect facility to become a home for live community theatre for Valdosta and the surrounding area. What you see tonight is the first step in a major renovation effort that will require nearly a quarter of a million dollars and several years of effort.

Many members of TGV have dedicated hundreds of hours of their time and several local businesses and individuals have donated materials and labor to our effort. What once was a sagging, termite riddled lobby floor has been totally replaced with new support and flooring. A handicapped accessible restroom has been added to the main floor and the main restrooms on the mezzanine level have been renovated. New fire safety fixtures, including exit lights and emergency lighting, have been installed. Additional electrical work has been done to improve safety and provide the necessary power to operate standard stage lighting fixtures.

In addition to the above, the old stage, designed for film presentation, was removed and a new 980 square foot stage built. You will note that the old proscenium arch is still in place, a continuing reminder of where we began several months ago. New seating, which we hope you will find comfortable, has also been added.

Where do we go from here? We have a long list of things that need to be done -new air conditioning and heating systems, a sprinkler system for the stage area, renovation of the marque and facade, a concession area in the lobby, a caterers work area, a tiered seating area with tables for dinner theatre, dressing rooms for the actors, complete stage lighting and sound systems, a faceliit for the celling and walls in the auditorium, gridwork over the stage to hold lights and drapes and much, much more.

How can you help? TGV wants the Valdosta Playhouse to be a facility that everyone in Valdosta and Lowndes County can be proud to call their own. We have embarked on a Capital Funds Campaign to realize this goal. Your contributions, both financial and in-kind materials and services, will assist us in developing the facility to its full potential.

Malcolm Rainey (Producer) has produced several shows for TGV and has been the treasurer for several years. Besides producing, he appeared as Bellamy in The Fantasticks. Watch for the announcement of the dedication of the Malcolm Rainey Memorial Bathroom.

This is Denise Steptoe's (Director) swan song for TGV, as she will be moving to Douglas following this production. She is a member of Ambassadors Livel and has served as secretary on the Board of TGV and costume mistress for several shows. This is her second effort at directing. Stage highlights include Sally in Auntie Mame, Gracie in Bus Stop, a stripper in Gypsy, Lady Calvarty in Clever Dick, Aunt Hannah in All The Way Home, and Rheba in You Can't Take It With You.

Kay Soutar (Assistant Director) made her acting debut as Aunt Sadie in All The Way Home and is now trying her hand in front of the footlights as Assistant Director.

Cherle Cade makes her first appearance with TGV as Florence. Cherle hails from California where she participated in high school drama and chorus.

Michael Lowe lends his talents to the character of Hannibal. Michael has been seen numerous times in TGV productions including Brighton Beach Memoirs, Bus Stop, The Fantasticks, and All The Way Home.

Mary Helen Kamarad plays Fairy May and finally has enough lines to make the effort worth while. The queen of the one liners loves the theatre and wants the bigger roles to keep coming.

Robert Swanson, another newcomer to TGV, plays the role of Jeffrey. He has performed with the Tifton and Albany theatre groups where he performed in My Fair Lady.

Mrs. Paddy is played by Mary Ann Green. Veteran audiences will remember her as Mama Rose in Gypsy. She has also directed several shows including You Can't Take It With You, Brighton Beach Memoirs, All My Sons, and All The Way Home.

Rick Patrick plays the role of Titus. A newcomer to TGV, Rick has been active with other groups since 1978. He has also toured with Up With People in the United States and Mexico.

Samuel is played by Jerry Ellis. Jerry is past president of TGV and has done just about everything else that needed doing. He has appeared in Bus Stop, Gypsy, All My Sons, and All The Way Home.

Kay Jennett portrays Lily Belle. She was Mrs. Upson in Auntle Mame and Trudy in Social Security.

Joanne Griner stars as Ethel Savage in this production. She has been involved in almost every production, either on or off stage, since TGV's inception. She is a charter member of TGV and has held several board positions. Her favorite roles include Mame in Auntie Mame and Kate in All My Sons. Our favorite is her shop stopping role as the rear of the cow in Gypsy.

Alma Nicholson, after a brief hiatus, returns to the TGV stage as Miss Willie. She directed this season's opener, Clever Dick, and starred in Witness for the Prosecution.

Charles Green, the perennial corpse, plays Dr. Emmett. Charles is the architect for the renovation of the theatre. He assumed clerical roles in Auntie Mame and All The Way Home and died three times in Clever Dick.

The Bear, as himself, makes his TGV debut.
