CAST NOTES

Jack Pruden makes his fourth TGV appearance in The Dining Room. He had supporting roles in Harvey and Arsenic and Old Lace, and was Aesop in The Fabulous Fable Factory. He is retired from careers in the Foreign Service and the information systems industry. He and wife Marjorie have resided in Valdosta since 1980.

Debbie Parrish has worked with the Bainbridge Little Theatre, Thomasville On Stage and Co., and the South Georgia Opera. Her first effort for TGV

was <u>The Fabulous Fable Factory</u>. When not at the theatre, she teaches at J. L. Newbern Middle School.

Brandon Bateman is excited about his first appearance for TGV. Most recently he was the Prince in <u>Sleeping Beauty</u> for the Florida Playwrights Theatre in Hollywood, Florida. He would like to thank those involved in this production for their support and patience.

Hope Ince is a veteran of the TGV stage, having appeared in recent productions of Nunsense, I Do!, I Do!, and Sound of Music. She has served as Musical Director for The Fantasticks!, Oliver! and The Fabulous Fable Factoroy and was Director of last season's The Foreigner.
