Cast Notes

Rick Patrick ("Froggy") is no stranger to the TGV stage, having appeared most recently as Elwood P. Dowd in HARVEY and as Capt. von Trapp in THE SOUND OF MUSIC. In 1980-1981 Rick toured the United States and Mexico with the international music group "Up With People". In 1985 he was selected as a State Finalist in the Florida Theatre Conference auditions and is a member of TGV's Ambassadors LIVE!. When not appearing on stage, Rick is an Advertising Consultant with FM-96.

Ricardo R. Ipina ("Charlie") is employed as a teacher of music and drama at Valdosta High School. He first appeared with TGV in the role of "El Gallo" in THE FANTASTICKS but has also sung in the chorus of GUYS AND DOLLS and THE MIKADO among many others. He served as Musical Director/Pianist in the TGV Fall production of THE SOUND OF MUSIC and has "done it all" in tech theatre. He serves as Co-Director/Performer with TGV's Ambassadors LIVE!

Mary Ann Green ("Betty") is no stranger to TGV audiences having directed several past productions and being remembered for her outstanding performance as "Mama Rose" in GYPSY. She is the current President of the TGV Board and is Department Manager of the Blood Bank at SGM C. As outstanding "moments" on stage, she remembers her debut in the 1st grade as a Christmas tree and her role as "Madame Arcati" in BLITHE SPIRIT opposite her daughter, Lisa.

Jennifer Clark ("Catherine") is a newcomer to the TGV stage after an outstanding "career" with Off Broadway of Lowndes High School. Her roles at LHS included "Sarah" in CHILDREN OF A LESSER GOD, "Raja" in I NEVER SAW ANOTHER BUTTERFLY and "Weeser" in STEEL MAGNOLIAS. She is employed at Mackey Lumber Co. and TGV looks forward to seeing Jennifer on our stage in the future.

TIM Smith ("David"), a Senior at Valdosta High School, made his debut with TGV in the role of "Matt" in THE FANTASTICKS.
