WHO'S WHO IN THE CAST & CREW

Kristy Barton (props mistress) is thrilled to be working backstage for this show because she now gets to wear one of the black headsets. Jim Britt (Assistant Director) is employed by Bell South and has been a member of TGV since 1990. He has worked on stage and behind the scenes in many plays throughout the years, most recently as 'Elisha Whitney' in Anything Goes. He will be directing TGV's spring production of Barefoot in the Park.

Brenda Kay Brunston (Director) is a graduate of the theatre program at Valdosta State University. She plans to attend graduate school next fall to continue her studies and receive a M.F.A. in Directing. She has directed previously at Valwood School and at Valdosta State University. She is the cutest little cookie girl down at the Great American Cookie Company in the Valdosta Mall.

This poignant story first evolved as a novel by Henry James entitled *Washington Square*. Most recently the revival of this play hit Broadway like a ton of bricks, winning several Tony Awards.

This production has been a hard labor, filled with several "firsts", for some their first production with the Theatre Guild, for others, their first full length period play or their first major role in a non-musical. But even with the obstacles of all these "firsts", the show has blossomed in only four and a half weeks into an experience in the excitement of love, true love For some characters and for others, the truth is a question.

I hope as the story of Catherine unveils, you, the audience, will be able to decide for yourselves the truth behind the motives and actions of Morris, and the strength or cruelness of Catherine. Enjoy the show.
